



發送多媒體訊息比發送文字訊息需要更多時間。在發送中,將顯示動畫指示符號。

無線網絡可能會限制 MMS 訊息的大小。如果插入的圖片大小超過此限制,手機可能會縮小圖片,以便能夠透過 MMS 發送。



## 未接來電、已接來電及已撥電話

要查看未接、已接及已撥電話的電話號碼,在待機模式下按功能表,然後選擇通話記錄。選擇

- 未接來電檢視他人嘗試致電給您的十個最近電話號碼(網絡服務)。
- 已接來電用於檢視已接來電的最近十個號碼(網絡服務)。
- 已撥電話用於檢視最近撥打或試撥的二十個電話號碼。請參閱 「撥打最近撥出的號碼」,刊於第6頁。
- 刪除最近記錄清除未接、已接及已撥電話的列表。

#### 有關未接、已接及已撥電話的備註

- 只有當系統支援以上功能、在開機狀態下及處於系統服務範圍內的時候,手機才會記錄未接來電及已接來電。
- 若您在未接來電、已接來電或已撥電話功能表內按操作,您可以,例如,檢視通話日期及時間、撥打記錄的電話號碼、儲存號碼至聯絡人列表或發送訊息至號碼。

### 通話計數器與通話計時器



注意:您的服務供應商對通話及服務所列出的實際發票可能會不同,這視乎網絡功能、開單時數目的四捨五入、稅 項等等因素而定。

在待機模式下按功能表,然後選擇通話記錄。選擇

- 通話計時檢視來電及撥出電話的大約通話時間。
- GPRS 計數器檢視在 GPRS 連接中發送及接收的數據量。
- GPRS 計時器檢視 GPRS 連接的大約時間。

# ■通訊錄 (功能表 3)

您可在手機及 SIM 卡的記憶體中儲存姓名及電話號碼 (聯絡人)。

要進入此功能表:在待機模式下按功能表,然後選擇通訊錄。

可儲存姓名的數目,視乎姓名的長度、相關的電話號碼及文字項目的數量及長度而定。手機支援可儲存多達 250 組姓名及電話號碼的 SIM 卡。

手機記憶體內的通訊錄使用共享記憶體,請參閱第 ix 頁。

### 進入此功能表功能的幾種方法

您可以透過在待機模式下按**名單**(或按捷徑存取功能,然後選擇 通訊錄)。

一些功能亦可用如下方式進入:在待機模式下按 (w) 或 (本), 捲動至需要的姓名,按**詳情**,捲動至電話號碼或文字項目,按**操** 作,然後選擇需要的功能。

#### 對每個姓名儲存多組電話號碼及文字項目

您可爲手機的通訊錄記憶體中的每個姓名儲存不同類型的電話號 碼及文字項目。

爲姓名儲存的第一個電話號碼爲預設號碼。以一個方框圍繞該號碼類型指示符表示,例如 配。從聯絡人列表選擇姓名時,例如要撥打電話,除非選擇了另一個號碼,否則會使用預設的號碼。

#### 刪除姓名附帶的電話號碼、文字項目或圖像

在待機模式下按 [一] 或 [一],捲動至需要的姓名(及電話號碼),然後按**詳情**。捲動至需要刪除的電話號碼、文字項目或圖像,按 操作,選擇適當的功能,然後按確認。

## 編輯姓名、電話號碼或文字項目

在待機模式下按 (一) 或 (一),捲動至您需要的姓名,然後按詳情。捲動至需要的姓名、電話號碼或文字項目,然後按操作。選擇需要的功能,例如修改詳情編輯文字項目。

- 號碼分組整理儲存於通訊錄功能表內的姓名及電話號碼至號碼分組。您可以爲每一個群組選擇顯示的鈴聲及分組圖案(當您收到屬於此群組的來電時)。

您可以從以下功能中選擇:重新命名、分組鈴聲、分組圖案、 分組成員。

#### 指定單鍵撥號的電話號碼

在待機模式下按功能表,然後選擇通訊錄及單鍵撥號。捲動至需要的鍵,然後按設定。按尋找,然後選擇您想爲選定鍵指定的姓名及電話號碼。

若此鍵已指定電話號碼,您可以檢視或更改號碼或刪除指定,按 操作,然後選擇需要的功能。

#### 名片

要發送名片至兼容手機或支援 vCard 標準的其他裝置:在待機模式下按 (一)或 (一),捲動至您需要的姓名,然後按**詳情**。按操作,然後選擇發送名片、經短訊息發送及經多媒體發送。(網絡服務)。

當您已接收名片,按顯示及儲存,將名片儲存至手機的記憶體內。要刪除名片,按退出及確認。

您可以在此功能表中更改手機的各種設定。亦可重 設某些功能表設定為預設值。



要進入此功能表:在待機模式下按功能表,然後選擇設定。

## 操作模式

手機有各種設定分組,「操作模式」,您可以爲不同情況及環境 設定適合的鈴聲。

**要進入此功能表**:在待機模式下按功能表,然後選擇設定及操作模式。

- 1. 選擇您需要啟動或更改設定的操作模式。
- 2. 選擇啓動、個人化選擇或定時。
  - 要啓動選定的模式,選擇啓動。

- 要啟動操作模式一段時間,選擇定時,然後設定結束時間。 當時間已到,原來沒有定時的操作模式便開始啟動。
- 要更改操作模式的設定,選擇個人化選擇。選擇您要更改的設定,然後更改。

選擇手機閃燈可為某些功能啟動螢幕燈及鍵盤燈。詳情請 參閱「燈光提示」,刊於第 xii 頁。

有關其他設定的資訊,請參閱「鈴聲設定」,刊於第44 頁。用更改模式名稱,您可以重新命名選擇的操作模式。 標準操作模式無法被重新命名。

目前啓動操作模式的名稱將在待機模式下顯示,除了標準操作模式啟動時。若操作模式設爲定時,名稱前會顯示 ③。

背景圖片設定手機在待機模式下顯示背景圖片。
 背景圖片可於多媒體資料功能表內找到。您可以儲存新的圖片,例如從多媒體訊息儲存。

要設定圖片爲背景圖片:

- 要第一次選擇背景圖片或更改圖片,選擇選擇背景圖片。
   捲動至您需要的資料夾,按打開,然後捲動至需要的圖片。
   按操作,然後選擇設定爲背景圖片。
- 若您已使用過背景圖片,但已選擇關,選擇開。
- 顏色模式選擇手機一些顯示部份的顏色,例如信號強度指示符。

- 日期設定在待機模式下顯示(或隱藏)日期、設定日期或選擇日期格式或日期分隔。若電池已從手機取出了很長時間,您可能需要重新設定日期。
- 選擇自動更新時間設定手機根據當前的時區自動更新時間及日期(網絡服務)。

自動更新日期及時間不會改變爲鬧鐘、日曆或提示備忘設定的 時間。

選擇GPRS連接及保持連線或當需要時。

 若選擇保持連線,當您開機時,手機會自動登入 GPRS 網絡 (若 GPRS 網絡在當前位置可用)。

若選擇當需要時,僅當您使用需要 GPRS 服務的功能時,手機才登入並連接至 GPRS 網絡。在這種情況下,建立連接所需的時間可能長於選擇保持連線。

#### GPRS 指示符

當選擇的 GPRS 連接模式是保持連線且 GPRS 服務可用時,**G** 將顯示於螢幕上。

若您在 GPRS 連接期間接聽來電或接收短訊息,或撥打電話, 圖將顯示於螢幕上,表示暫停 GPRS 連接 (保留)。手機將在通話 後嘗試重新建立連接。

## 通話設定

**要進入此功能表**:在待機模式下按功能表,然後選擇設定及通話 設定。選擇

 來電轉接將您的來電轉接至留言信箱或另一電話號碼(網絡服務)。若您的 SIM 卡或網絡商不支援轉接功能,則不會顯示此 選項。

選擇您需要的轉接選項,例如通話中轉接來電,當您在通話中或拒絕來電時,轉接來電。設定轉接選項爲開啓(啓動)或關閉(取消),或查看選項是否開啟(檢查狀態)。

 若選擇啓動,選擇來電轉接的位置。對於一些轉接選項, 您亦可選擇多長時間後轉接來電。

可同時啓動多個轉接選項。當所有來電被轉接時, **→** 會顯示 於待機模式下。

自動音量控制及開設定手機在通話時自動將耳機的音量保留為您用或選擇的音量水平。例如,若環境太嘈雜,手機將增大音量。

- 記憶體狀態檢視可用記憶體及已用記憶體的總量,以及不同的功能需要使用的記憶體數量。
- 自動鍵盤鎖設定手機在待機模式下一段時間後自動鎖定鍵盤。 請參閱「鍵盤鎖(按鍵保護)」,刊於第9頁。 要啟動自動鍵盤鎖,選擇開,然後設定多長時間後鍵盤被鎖 定。要關閉自動鍵盤鎖,選擇關。

當鍵盤鎖定時,可以撥打已編入本手機內的官方緊急號碼。

- 小區訊息顯示將手機設定在使用以微蜂窩網絡(MCN)技術爲基礎的流動網絡時,會有所顯示(網絡服務)。
- 問候語設定手機在開機時快速顯示的問候語。要儲存問候語, 按操作,然後選擇儲存。
- 網絡商選擇設定手機自動選擇您所在區域的流動網絡(自動)或 從列表中選擇需要的網絡(手動)。

選定網絡必須與您本地網絡商的網絡簽有漫遊協議。若顯示未 註冊使用該網絡,請選擇其他網絡。

手機會一直處於手動模式,直到選擇了自動模式或在手機中放入了另一張 SIM 卡。

- 說明訊息顯示設定手機顯示說明文字,指示您使用功能表功能。
- 開機鈴聲設定手機在開機時播放鈴聲。

## 增強配套設定

您可以設定當手機連接至兼容的增強配套時的預設設定。

**要進入此功能表**:在待機模式下按功能表,然後選擇設定及配套 設定。

選擇需要的增強配套,例如耳機。您可以從以下功能進行選擇 (視乎增強配套而定):

- 預設模式用於選擇在連接選定的增強配套後自動啟動的操作模式。
- 自動接聽用於設定手機在收到來電五秒後自動接聽。若來電提示設定爲嗶一聲或關,將無法使用自動接聽功能。

• 燈光用於將燈光設定爲開或關。

### 待機模式下的增強配套指示符

當兼容的增強配套已連接至手機,對應的指示符(例如 ♠)將顯示於待機模式下。

## 保密設定

**要進入此功能表**:在待機模式下按功能表,然後選擇設定及保密 設定。

如果正在使用限制通話的安全功能 (如通話限制、封閉用戶組及固定撥號),仍可撥打預先編入手機的官方緊急電話號碼。

### 選擇

- 開機 PIN 碼設定在每次開機時,手機要求輸入開機 PIN 碼。
   一些 SIM 卡不允許更改此設定。
- 通話限制限制用手機撥打或接聽的電話(網絡服務)。
- 固定撥號若您的 SIM 卡允許,限制從您手機至選定電話號碼的通話及短訊息(網絡服務)。
  - 固定撥號選項開啓時,GPRS連接僅可用於發送文字訊息。收 訊人的電話號碼及訊息中心號碼必須包括在固定撥號列表中。
- 封閉用戶組指定可以與您互通電話的一組人(網絡服務)。當您 使用封閉用戶組,群組號碼會在待機模式下顯示。

保密項目設定手機要求保密碼的時間。

若您選擇手機,當已插入新的 SIM 卡時,手機將要求輸入保密碼。

若您選擇手機通訊錄,則當使用的記憶體是 SIM 卡及您需要 更改記憶體至手機或手機和 SIM 卡,或從聯絡人列表複製姓 名及電話號碼至其他列表時,手機將要求輸入保密碼。

當您更改此設定時,功能表未接來電、已接來電及已撥電話內的電話號碼將被刪除。

密碼功能用於更改保密碼、PIN碼、PIN2碼或限制密碼。密碼只能由0到9的數字組成。

## 恢復原廠設定

您亦可以重設某些功能表設定爲原始值。

在待機模式下按**功能表**,然後選擇設定及原廠設定。輸入保密碼,然後按**確認**。請注意,此功能不會刪除您已儲存或下載至手機內的資料。

# ■多媒體資料 (功能表 5)



在此功能表內,您可以管理您已(例如從多媒體訊息)儲存的圖片及鈴聲。支援JPEG及BMP格式檔案。這些檔案在資料夾內整理妥當。

您的手機支援數碼版權管理 (DRM) 系統,該系統用於保護手機所獲得的內容。每一項內容,如鈴聲,都可以有一些使用規則並受其保護,例如,使用的次數及一定的使用期限。規則在內容的啓動密鑰中設定,可以與內容一起傳送,亦可單獨傳送,視乎服務供應商而定。您可以更新這些啓動密鑰。在申請各項服務內容及啟動密鑰的傳送條款之前,請先檢查,因爲可能要收取一定費用。

多媒體資料使用共享記憶體,請參閱第 ix 頁。

- 1. 按功能表, 然後選擇多媒體資料。會顯示選項列表。
- 2. 選擇顯示資料夾,開啟資料夾列表。

#### 其他選項為:

- 新增資料夾、刪除資料夾、重新命名資料夾:您可以新增 一個資料夾或刪除或重新命名您選擇的資料夾。預設資料 夾無法刪除或重新命名。
- 記憶體狀態:檢視在每個記憶體中有多少可用記憶體。
- 下載:您可以下載圖像及鈴聲(網絡服務)。會顯示一個書籤列表。若您想在服務功能表內檢視可用的書籤,選擇更多書籤。選擇您想進入瀏覽頁的書籤。遵循服務提供的指引。

3. 要開啓資料夾,捲動至需要的資料夾,然後按**打開**。將顯示資 料夾內的檔案。

按操作可以存取「多媒體資料中的檔案選項」中第55頁所述的一些功能。

4. 要檢視圖像或收聽聲音,捲動至需要的圖像或聲音檔案,按操作,然後選擇打開。

### 多媒體資料中的檔案選項

# 6. 電池資訊

## ■充電及放電

本手機由充電電池供電。新電池在二至三次完全充電及放電之後 方可達到最佳性能。電池可以充電及放電數百次,但最終亦會失 效。如果通話及待機時間明顯少於正常時間,就該更換電池了。 請僅使用 Nokia 認可的電池,並僅使用 Nokia 認可的為本手機指 定的充電器爲電池充電。

如果首次使用備用電池,或者如果電池長時間未使用,需要將電池連接至充電器,然後斷開,再重新連接電池以開始充電。

不使用充電器時將其從電源插座及手機上拔下。請勿將充滿電的 電池連接至充電器,因爲過度充電會縮短電池的壽命。如果充滿 電的電池擱置不用,電池本身便會不斷放電。

如果電池已完全放電,可能要在充電幾分鐘之後充電指示符才會 顯示於螢幕上或才能撥打電話。

不要把電池作其他用途。請勿使用損壞的充電器或電池。

請勿將電池丟入火中,因爲電池在火中會發生爆炸。電池亦可能 在受到損毀時發生爆炸。請依照當地法規處理電池。如有可能, 請將電池回收利用。請勿將電池當作家居廢物般處置。





# 8. 保養及維護



The right selection key can be *Contacts* or the function selected in the *Right* selection key setting in the *Personal* shortcuts menu, or it may be a name or logo specific to a network operator.

- 6. Selection keys and —, each key performs the function displayed above it.
- 7. 4-way scroll keys (<, >, ^ and ~)

Enable scrolling through names, phone numbers, menus or settings. During a call, press > to increase and < to decrease the earpiece volume. In standby mode, press


# Inserting a SIM card

Keep all SIM cards out of the reach of small children.

For availability and information on using SIM card services, contact your SIM card vendor. This may be the service provider, network operator, or other vendor.

Open the SIM cover on the side of the phone by pulling it out and bending it down (1). Insert the SIM card into the phone with the bevelled corner facing right (2). Push the SIM card in and close the SIM cover (3).

Note that if you remove your SIM card while using the phone, *Insert SIM card* appears on the display. Reinsert your SIM card and enter your PIN to restart your phone.



# Inserting a battery

Always switch the device off and disconnect the charger before removing the battery.

Release the catch (1). Remove the back cover (2). Insert the battery (3). Replace the back cover (4).



# Putting on the wrist strap

Connect the wrist strap as indicated.



# Opening the fold

To use the phone, you must open the fold as shown in the figure. Do not try to force the fold to open more than the hinge allows.

Close the fold by pushing from the top part of the phone, not from the hinge.



# ■ Switching the phone on and off

Press and hold the power key for more than 3 seconds.

- If the phone asks for a PIN code or security code, key in the code and press OK.
- If the phone displays Insert SIM card even though the SIM card is
  properly inserted, or SIM card not supported, contact your network
  operator or service provider. Your phone does not support 5-Volt SIM
  cards and the card may need to be changed.

Your device has an internal antenna.



Note: As with any other radio transmitting device, do not touch the antenna unnecessarily when the device is switched on. Contact with the antenna affects call quality and may cause the device to operate at a higher power level than otherwise needed. Avoiding contact with the antenna area when operating the device optimises the antenna performance and the battery life.

# 2. Basic functions

# Making a call

- 1. Open the fold and key in the phone number, including the area code.
  - To make international calls: Press twice for the + character and key in the country code, area code (omit the leading zero, if necessary) and phone number.

Press *Clear* to delete the last entered digit.

- Press \_\_ to call the number. Press > to increase or < to decrease the volume of the earpiece or headset.
- Press no or close the fold to end the call or to cancel the call attempt.

### Making a call using the contacts list

In standby mode, press or to find the name that you want. Press to call the number.

### Calling a recently dialled number

To redial one of the last twenty phone numbers that you have called or attempted to call, press \_\_ once in standby mode, scroll to the phone number or name you want, and press \_\_.

### Calling your voice mailbox

To call your voice mailbox (network service) in standby mode, press and hold  $\begin{bmatrix} -\frac{1}{\omega} \end{bmatrix}$ , or press  $\begin{bmatrix} -\frac{1}{\omega} \end{bmatrix}$  and  $\begin{bmatrix} -\frac{1}{\omega} \end{bmatrix}$ .

When you have received a voice message, on may be shown at the top of the display (network service). Press **Listen** to call your voice mailbox.

For more information on voice messages, see "Voice messages" on page 27.

### Speed dialling a phone number

If you have assigned a phone number to one of the keys  $\frac{1}{2}$  to  $\frac{1}{2}$ , you can call the phone number by choosing one of the two options below:

- In standby mode, press the desired number key and \_\_\_\_.
- If the Speed dialling function is set on, press and hold the number key in standby mode until the call is started.

For more information on assigning speed dial keys, see "Speed dials" on page 38.

For more information on the *Speed dialling* function, see "Call settings" on page 46.

### In-call operations

You can press **Options** for some of the following functions during a call:

Mute or Unmute, End call, End all calls, Contacts, Menu, Hold or Unhold, New call (network service), Conference (network service), Private call (network service), Answer, Reject, Swap (network service), Send DTMF, Lock keypad, Transfer (network service), Headset, Auto volume on or Auto volume off.

#### Select

- Auto volume on | Auto volume off to set the automatic volume control to on or off. See "Call settings" on page 46.
- Transfer to connect the held call to the active call and to disconnect yourself from the call.
- Headset to switch the active call to the respective compatible accessory when the accessory is connected to the phone.

To make another call during a call (network service), press **Options** and select *New call*. Key in the phone number, or search for it in the contacts, and press **Call** or \_\_\_\_\_. The first call is put on hold.

- To switch between the two calls, press Swap or \_\_\_\_. To end the active call, press \_\_\_\_\_, or press Options and select End call. To end both calls, press Options and select End all calls.
- To join the two calls into a conference call (network service), press
   Options and select Conference. To have a private conversation with
   one of the participants, select Private call and the participant. To rejoin
   the call, select Conference. To end the call, press

# Answering or rejecting an incoming call

Open the fold and press \_\_\_ to answer the call. If you do not press \_\_ within five seconds, the call is automatically answered. If you want to mute the ringing tone, press **Silence**.

To reject the call, press , or press **Options** and select *Reject*. You can also open the fold and close it within 1.5 seconds to reject a call. The rejected call will be diverted if you have activated a call divert option such as *Divert if busy*.

### Call waiting

You can answer a call while you have another call in progress if you have activated the *Call waiting* function in the *Call settings* menu (network service). To answer the waiting call, press *Answer* or \_\_\_\_. The first call is put on hold.

# Keypad lock (Keyguard)

You can lock the keypad to prevent the keys being accidentally pressed.

To lock the keypad, press **Menu** in standby mode and then quickly. Keyguard is not activated when you close the fold. When the keypad is locked, **1** is shown at the top of the display. To unlock the keypad, press **Unlock** and quickly.

When the keypad is locked, you can answer a call by pressing \_\_\_\_. During a call, the phone can be operated normally. When you end or reject the call, the keypad will automatically be locked.

For information on setting the keypad to lock automatically after a certain length of time, see *Automatic keyguard* on page 48.

When the keypad lock is on, calls may be possible to the official emergency number programmed into your device.

# 3. Writing text

You can key in text in two different ways, using traditional text input  $\mathfrak{V}$ , or predictive text input (built-in dictionary)  $\mathfrak{L}$ .

To quickly change the text input method when writing text, press twice.

**Using traditional text input:** Press repeatedly the key marked with the letter that you want until the letter appears.

### Using predictive text input:

- 2. If the displayed word is the one that you want, press and start writing the next word.
  - If you want to change the word, press repeatedly until the word that you want appears.
  - If the "?" is displayed after the word, the word is not in the dictionary. To add the word to the dictionary, press Spell, key in the word (traditional text input is used) and press OK.

### Tips for writing text with traditional and predictive text input:

- To move the cursor left or right, press or , respectively.
- To add a space, press 🖭.
- To delete the character to the left of the cursor, press Clear. To clear the screen, press and hold Clear.
- To switch between upper and lower cases, or between traditional and predictive text input, press repeatedly and check the indicator at the top of the display.
- To add a number, press and hold the desired key.
- To get a list of special characters, press and hold , select the character that you want, and press Use. In traditional text input, you can also add punctuation marks and certain special characters by pressing , pepeatedly.
- Traditional: To key in a letter which is on the same key as the previous one, press or (or wait until the cursor appears), and key in the new letter.
- Predictive: To add a compound word, key in the first half of the word, press \_\_\_\_, and then key in the second half.

# 4. Using the menu

Most of the menu functions are provided with a brief help text. To view the help text, scroll to the desired menu function and wait for about 15 seconds.

For information on switching the *Help text activation* function on or off, see the "Phone settings" menu on page 47.

# Accessing a menu function

### By scrolling

- 1. Press Menu in standby mode.
- Press or to scroll to the main menu that you want, and press Select to enter it.
- Scroll to a submenu and press Select.If the submenu contains further submenus repeat this step.
- Press Back to return to the previous menu level, or press Exit or months to exit to standby mode.

### By using a shortcut number

The menus, submenus and setting options are numbered. The shortcut number is shown at the top right of the display.

Press **Menu** in standby mode. Within two seconds, key in the shortcut number of the main menu that you want to open. Repeat this for the submenu and setting option.

# ■ Messages (Menu 1)



Before you can send text, picture, multimedia, or e-mail messages, you must set your message settings. For more information, see "Message settings" on page 28.



**Note:** When sending messages, your device may display the words "*Message Sent*". This is an indication that the message has been sent by your device to the message centre number programmed into your device. This is not an indication that the message has been received at the intended destination. For more details about messaging services, check with your service provider.

# Text and picture messages (SMS)

You can write and send multi-part messages, which may include pictures, consisting of several ordinary text messages (Network Service). Invoicing may be based upon the number of ordinary messages that are needed for any multi-part message. The number of available characters/the current part number of a multi-part message is shown on the top right of the display, for example 120/2. If you use special characters, such as Cyrillic characters, more parts may be needed for the message than would otherwise be required. Note that predictive text input may use special characters.



Note: The picture message function can be used only if it is supported by your network operator or service provider. Only compatible devices that offer picture message features can receive and display picture messages. The appearance of a message may vary depending on the receiving device.

### Writing and sending a text or picture message

- Press Menu in standby mode and select Messages, Text messages and Create message.
- 2. Key in a message. See "Writing text" on page 10.
- To insert a picture, or a phone number or name from the contacts list into the message, press Options and select:
  - Insert picture. Scroll to the desired picture, press View and Insert. If you wish, press Options and select an option to preview and change the message before sending it.
  - *Insert number.* Press **Search** or and select the number.
  - Insert contact. Scroll to the desired name and press Options. Select
     Insert contact or View details if you want to insert a number or text
     item saved with the name.
- To use a predefined text as a base for the message, press Options and select *Use template* and the desired template.
- To save the message in the Saved text msgs. or Templates folder or in a folder that you have created inside the My folders folder, press Options and select Save message.

- 3. To send the message, press , or press **Options** and select *Send*, key in the recipient's phone number or search for it in the contacts list, and press **OK**.
- To send a message to several people, press Options and select Sending options and Send to many. Scroll to the first recipient and press Send.
   When you have selected all your recipients, press Done.
- To send a message using predefined settings, press Options and select Sending options and Sending profile.

The sent message is saved in the *Sent items* folder.

Your device supports the sending of text messages beyond the character limit for a single message. Longer messages are sent as a series of two or more messages. Your service provider may charge accordingly. Characters that use accents or other marks, and characters from some language options like Chinese, take up more space limiting the number of characters that can be sent in a single message.

### Writing and sending an e-mail message

You may be able to write and send e-mail messages (network service). To save an e-mail address in the phone book, see "Saving multiple numbers and text items per name" on page 34.

- Press Menu, and select Messages, Text messages and Create SMS e-mail.
- 2. Key in the recipient's e-mail address or search for it in the contacts list and press **OK**.
- 3. If you wish, key in the subject for the message and press **OK**.

- 4. Key in the e-mail message.
- To send the message, press Options, select Send SMS e-mail and press OK.

### Reading and replying to a text, picture or e-mail message



**Important:** Exercise caution when opening messages. E-mail messages may contain malicious software or otherwise be harmful to your device or PC.

When you receive a message, the ☐ indicator and the number of new messages followed by ... messages received are shown.

If the Indicator blinks, the text message memory is full. For information on deleting messages, see "Deleting messages" on page 27.

- Press Show to view the new message immediately.
   To view the messages later, press Exit. When you want to read the messages, press Menu and select Messages, Text messages and Inbox.
- 2. Select the message that you want to read, and use the scroll keys to browse through the message. 

  ☐ indicates an unread message.
- To reply to the displayed message, press **Options** and select *Reply*.
  - *Empty screen* to write a message from scratch.
  - Original text to include the original message in the reply.
  - Template to use a preset text as a base for the new message. For information on the templates, see "Folders for text and picture messages" on page 22.

When replying to an e-mail message, confirm or edit the e-mail address and subject and then write your reply.

4. To send your reply, press **Options**, select *Send*, and press **OK**. **OR**: Press twice.

### Other functions accessible with the Options key

While reading a message, pressing **Options** also allows access to the following functions: *Delete, Use detail, Forward, Edit* (for text messages) / *Edit text* (for picture messages), *Move, Rename, Copy to calendar, Save picture* (for picture messages), *Message details*.

### Select

- Use detail to extract a phone number, e-mail address or Web address from the message.
- Copy to calendar to copy the message text to your phone's calendar as a memo.
- Save picture to save the picture included in a picture message in the Templates folder.

### **Distribution lists**

To send messages to a fixed group of people, you can define a distribution list for that purpose in the phone's memory. The phone sends the message separately to each recipient on the list. Therefore, sending a message using a distribution list may cost more than sending a message to one recipient.

Distribution lists use shared memory, see "Shared Memory" on page ix.

Press **Menu** in standby mode and select *Messages*, *Text messages* and *Distribution lists*.

- To add a list, press Add (if there are no lists) or press Options and select Add list. Enter the name for the list.
- To add a contact to the list, scroll to the list, press Options and select View list. Press Add (if there are no lists) or press Options and select Add contact. Select a contact from the phone's or SIM card's contact memory.

After writing a message, to send the message using a distribution list, press **Options**, select *Sending options* and *Send to list*.

## Folders for text and picture messages

To open a folder, press **Menu** in standby mode, and select *Messages, Text messages* and then *Inbox*, *Sent items, Saved text msgs.*, *Templates* or *My folders*.

- In Templates, you can save text messages that you want to use as a base for new messages. Text templates are indicated by and picture templates by.
  - To edit or delete a template, select the desired template, press **Options**, and select the desired function.
- In My folders you can create new folders for your messages.
   To add a folder, press Add (if the folder list is empty) or press Options and select Add folder. To delete or rename a folder, press Options and select the desired function.

## Multimedia messages (MMS)

The phone can send and receive multimedia messages of up to 100 kilobytes (network service).



**Note:** Only devices that have compatible features can receive and display multimedia messages. The appearance of a message may vary depending on the receiving device.

If *Allow multimedia reception* is set to *Yes* or *In home network*, your operator or service provider may charge you for every message you receive.

Note that multimedia messages cannot be received during a call, while using a game or another Java application or when you have an active browsing session using the GSM data bearer (see "Keying in the service settings manually" on page 64).

Because delivery of multimedia messages can fail for a variety of reasons, do not rely solely upon them for essential communications.

Sent and received multimedia messages use shared memory, see page ix.

The default setting of the multimedia message service is generally set to on.

The appearance of a multimedia message may vary depending on the receiving device.

Copyright protections may prevent some images, music (including ringing tones), and other content from being copied, modified, transferred or forwarded.

## Writing and sending a multimedia message

Before sending a multimedia message, read Notes for sending a multimedia message on page 25.

- Press Menu in standby mode, and select Messages, Multimedia msgs. and Create message.
- 2. Key in a message. See "Writing text" on page 10.
  - To insert an image, press Options and select *Insert*.
     Open a specific folder in the *Gallery* menu, scroll to the desired image or sound, press Options and select *Insert*.
  - Your phone supports multimedia messages that contain several pages. To add a new slide to the message, press **Options** and select *Insert* and *Slide*. Each slide can contain text and one image.

### Select Options and:

- Previous slide, Next slide or Slide list to navigate between slides.
- *Slide timing* to define how long each slide is shown.
- Place text first or Place text last to move the text position.
- To insert a business card or a calendar note for a compatible device, press Options and select *Insert* and the desired option.
- To insert a name or number from the contacts list, press Options, select More options, and Insert contact and the desired name or Insert number.
- To delete an image or slide from the message, press Options and select <u>Delete</u> and the desired function.

- To save the message in the Saved items folder, press Options and select Save message.
- To add a subject to the message, press Options and select More options and Edit subject.
- To view the size or recipient of the message, press Options and select More options and Message details.
- To view the message or slide presentation before sending it, press Options and select *Preview*.
- To send the message, press Options and select Send to number (or Send to e-mail or Send to many).
- 4. Key in the recipient's phone number or e-mail address, or search for it in the contacts list. Press **OK** to send the message.

If you selected *Send to many* in step 3, press **Options**, select *Search number* or *Search e-mail*, and select the recipients one by one from the contacts list. To send the message, press , or press **Done** and **Options** and select *Send*.

The message is saved in the *Outbox* folder until it is sent. The sent messages are saved in the *Sent items* folder if the *Save sent messages* setting is *Yes*. See "Settings for multimedia messages" on page 29.

## Notes for sending a multimedia message

It may take more time to send a multimedia message than a text
message. During sending, the animated @ indicator is displayed and
you can use most of the other functions of the phone.

If the transmission is interrupted, the phone tries to re-send the message a few times. If the transmission fails, the message remains in the *Outbox* folder where you can try to re-send it later.

The wireless network may limit the size of MMS messages. If the inserted picture exceeds this limit, the device may make it smaller so that it can be sent by MMS.

## Reading and replying to a multimedia message



**Important:** Exercise caution when opening messages. Multimedia message objects may contain malicious software or otherwise be harmful to your device or PC.

When the phone is receiving a multimedia message, the animated indicator is displayed. When the message has been received, the indicator and the text *Multimedia message received* are shown.

If the 🔁 indicator blinks, the memory for multimedia messages is full. For information on deleting messages, see "Deleting messages" on page 27.

- Scroll through the message. If the message contains a slide presentation, the presentation is played automatically.

You can press **Options** for the following functions: *Play presentation, Continue present., View text, Open image, Delete message, Reply | Reply to all, Use detail, Forward to no., Forward to e-mail | Forward to many.* Select

- View text to view the text part of the message.
- Open image to view the image included in the message. Press
   Options to zoom in or out on the image, save it in the Gallery
   menu, set its contrast or view its details.

# **Deleting messages**

To delete a text or multimedia message that you are reading or viewing, press **Options** and select the desired function.

To delete all messages from a folder or all the folders:

- Press Menu in standby mode and select Messages, Text messages or Multimedia msgs., and Delete messages.
- To delete all the messages from a folder, select the desired folder and press OK.

To delete all the messages from all the text message folders, select *All messages* and press **OK**.

# Voice messages

Voice mailbox is a network service and you may need to subscribe to it first.

Press **Menu** in standby mode, and select *Messages* and *Voice messages*. Select *Voice mailbox number* to save the number of your voice mailbox or *Listen to voice messages* to call it.



Tip: To quickly call your voice mailbox, press and hold -1.

# Info messages

This network service allows you to receive messages on various topics from your service provider.

Press **Menu** in standby mode, and select *Messages* and *Info messages*. For available topics and the relevant topic numbers, contact your service provider.

# Message settings

## Settings for text and e-mail messages

Press **Menu** in standby mode, and select *Messages, Message settings, Text messages* and *Sending profile*. Select the group of settings ('sending profile') that you want to change. Next, select

- Message centre number to save the phone number needed for sending text and picture messages. You obtain this number from your service provider.
- Messages sent via to choose the message type Text, E-mail, Paging or Fax (network service).
- Message validity to choose how long the network should attempt to deliver your message to its recipient (network service).

- Default recipient number to save a phone number where messages are sent by default when this sending profile is used. This setting is shown when the Messages sent via setting is Text.
  - If the *Messages sent via* setting is *E-mail*, this setting is *E-mail server* and it allows you to save the phone number of the e-mail server.
- Delivery reports to request the network to send delivery reports on your messages (network service).
- Use GPRS and Yes to set the phone to send text messages over a GPRS connection, if this is possible. Also, you can set the GPRS connection to Always online, see "GPRS connection" on page 45.
- Reply via same centre to allow the recipient of your message to send you a reply message via your message centre (network service).
- Rename sending profile to change the name of the sending profile. The name of the default profile cannot be changed.

### **Overwriting settings**

You can set the phone to automatically replace old messages with new ones. Press **Menu** in standby mode, and select *Messages*, *Message settings*, *Text messages* and *Overwriting in sent items* or *Overwriting in inbox*. Select *Allowed* to set the phone to replace the old text messages with new ones in the *Sent items* or *Inbox* folder, respectively.

## Settings for multimedia messages

Press **Menu**, and select *Messages*, *Message settings* and *Multimedia msgs.*. Select

#### Menu functions

- Save sent messages and Yes to set the phone to save sent multimedia
  messages in the Sent items folder. If you select No, the sent messages
  are not saved.
- Delivery reports to request the network to send delivery reports on your messages (network service).
- Scale image down to select whether images are scaled to a smaller size when inserted into a message.
- Default slide timing to define how long each slide in your presentations is shown by default.
- Allow multimedia reception to allow (Yes) or prevent (No) the reception of multimedia messages or to allow it only in your home network (In home network).
- Incoming multimedia messages to set the phone to automatically retrieve received multimedia messages (Retrieve), or select Reject if you do not want to receive multimedia messages.
  - This setting is not shown if *Allow multimedia reception* is set to *No*.
- Connection settings to define the browser settings for retrieving newly received multimedia messages. Activate the connection set where you want to save the settings and then edit them. See also "Keying in the service settings manually" on page 64.
  - For proper settings, contact your network operator or service provider.
- Allow adverts to allow or prevent the reception of advertisements. This
  setting is not shown if Allow multimedia reception is set to No or if
  Incoming multimedia messages is set to Reject.

## Font size setting

To select the font size for reading and writing messages, press **Menu**, and select *Messages*, *Message settings*, *Other settings* and *Font size*.

### Service commands

You can send service requests to your service provider (network service). To access this menu, press **Menu** in standby mode, and select *Messages* and *Service commands*. Key in the desired characters and press **Send**.

# Call register (Menu 2)



In this menu, you can view the phone numbers of missed, received and dialled calls, and the approximate length of your calls.

## Missed, received and dialled calls

To view the phone numbers of missed, received and dialled calls, press **Menu** in standby mode and select *Call register*. Select

- Missed calls to view up to ten phone numbers from which somebody
  has most recently tried to call you with no success (network service).
- Received calls to view up to ten phone numbers from which you have most recently accepted calls (network service).
- Dialled numbers to view up to twenty phone numbers that you have most recently called or attempted to call. See also "Calling a recently dialled number" on page 6.

 Delete recent call lists to clear the lists of missed, received, and dialled calls.

### Notes about missed, received and dialled calls

- The phone registers missed and received calls only if the network supports these functions and the phone is switched on and within the network's service area.
- If you press Options in the Missed calls, Received calls or Dialled numbers menu, you can, for example, view the date and time of the call, call the registered phone number, save it in the contacts list or send a message to the number.

### Call counters and call timers



**Note:** The actual invoice for calls and services from your service provider may vary, depending on network features, rounding off for billing, taxes and so forth.

Press Menu in standby mode and select Call register. Select

- Call duration to view the approximate duration of your incoming and outgoing calls.
- GPRS data counter to view the amount of data that has been sent and received during the GPRS connections.
- GPRS connection timer to view the approximate duration of GPRS connections.

# ■ Contacts (Menu 3)



You can save names and phone numbers (contacts) in the phone's memory and in the SIM card's memory.

To access this menu: Press Menu in standby mode and select Contacts.

The number of names that can be saved depends on their length, and the number and length of related phone numbers and text items. The phone supports SIM cards that can save up to 250 names and phone numbers.

Contacts saved in the phone's memory use shared memory, see page ix.

## Alternative ways to access the functions in this menu

You can access the functions by pressing **Contacts** in standby mode (or by pressing **Go to** and selecting *Contacts*).

Some of the functions can also be accessed as follows: Press or in standby mode, scroll to the name that you want, press **Details**, scroll to a number or text item, press **Options** and select the desired function.

To access the contacts during a call, press **Options** and select *Contacts*.

# Selecting the settings for contacts

Press Menu in standby mode and select Contacts and Settings. Select

Memory in use to select the contact memory that you want to use. If
you want to search for names and phone numbers in both memories,
select Phone and SIM. In this case, the names and numbers will be
saved in the phone's memory.

- Contacts view to select how the names, numbers and images are displayed in the contacts list. For example, select Name and image to view the names with the attached images.
- Memory status to view how much free memory is available in each contact memory.

## Saving names and phone numbers

- Press Menu in standby mode and select Contacts and Add new contact.
- 2. Key in the name and press **OK** to save it.
- 3. Key in the phone number, including the area code, and press **OK** to save it.
  - To use the phone number while abroad, press twice (for the + character) and key in the country code, area code (omit the leading zero, if necessary) and phone number.
- 4. When the name and number are saved, press **Done**.
- Tip: To quickly save a name and phone number, key in the phone number in standby mode, press **Options** and select *Save*.

## Saving multiple numbers and text items per name

You can save different types of numbers and text items per name in the phone's contact memory.

The first phone number that you save with the name is the default number. It is indicated with a frame around the number type indicator, for example . When you select a name from the contacts list, for example

to make a call, the default number is used unless you select another number.

- 1. Make sure that the selected memory is *Phone* or *Phone and SIM*.
- 2. Press or in standby mode.
- 3. Scroll to the name to which you want to add a number or text item, and press **Details**.
- 4. Press **Options**, and select *Add number*, *Add detail* or *Change type*.
  - To add a phone number, select Add number and a number type. Key in the number, and press OK to save it.

  - To change the type of the selected number or text item, select Change type and the desired type.
- 5. Press **Back** and then **Exit** to return to standby mode.

### Changing the default number

Press or in standby mode, scroll to the desired name and press **Details**. Scroll to the number that you want to set as the default number. Press **Options** and select *Set as default*.

## Adding an image to a saved name or number

You can add an image to a name or number saved in the phone's memory. The image is shown when you receive a call from the given phone number.

Press or in standby mode, scroll to the name (and number) to which you want to add an image and press **Details**. Press **Options** and select *Add image*. The list of folders in the *Gallery* menu is shown. Scroll to the desired image, press **Options** and select *Save to contacts*.

# Searching for a name in the contacts

- Press Menu in standby mode and select Contacts and Search. OR:
   Press or in standby mode.
- 2. Key in the first letter(s) of the desired name, if you want.
- 3. Scroll to the desired name, and press **Details**. If the name is saved on the SIM card, **(3)** is shown at the top of the display.
- 4. Scroll through the phone numbers and text items added to the name.

# **Deleting contacts**

Press **Menu** in standby mode and select *Contacts* and *Delete*. Select *One by one* or *Delete all*.

Deleting a name and number will also delete the additional numbers, text items and image added to it. Deleting an image from the contacts does not delete it from the *Gallery* menu.

### Deleting a number, text item or image added to a name

Press or in standby mode, scroll to the desired name (and number) and press **Details**. Scroll to the number, text item or image that you want to delete, press **Options**, select the appropriate function, and press **OK**.

## Editing a name, number or text item

Press or in standby mode, scroll to the desired name and press **Details**. Scroll to the desired name, number or text item and press **Options**. Select the desired function, for example *Edit detail* to edit a text item.

# **Copying contacts**

You can copy names and phone numbers from the phone to the SIM card and vice versa. Text items or images saved in the phone will not be copied to the SIM card.

Press **Menu** in standby mode and select *Contacts* and *Copy*. Select the copying direction. Select *One by one*, *All* or *Default numbers* (shown when you copy from the phone). Select whether you want to keep the original names and numbers (*Keep original*) or move them (*Move original*).

### Other functions related to the contacts list

To access the following functions, press **Menu** in standby mode and select *Contacts*. Select

- Info numbers to call the information numbers of your service provider
  if they are available on your SIM card (network service).
- Service numbers to call the service numbers of your service provider if they are available on your SIM card (network service).
- My numbers to view the phone numbers assigned to your SIM card if this is allowed by the card.

#### Menu functions

 Caller groups to arrange the names and phone numbers saved in the Contacts menu into caller groups. For each group, you can select a ringing tone and a logo that is shown when you receive a call from an identified phone number that belongs to the given group.

You can select from the following functions: *Group name*, *Group ringing tone*, *Group logo*, *Group members*.

If you selected *Group members*, press **Add** (or press **Options** and select *Add contact*) to add a name to the group. To delete a name from the group, press **Options** and select *Remove contact*.

See also Alert for in "Tone settings" on page 40.

## Speed dials

You can set the keys  $\frac{1}{2k}$  to  $\frac{1}{m_{NL}}$  to work as speed dialling keys. To make a call using speed dialling, see page 7.

## Assigning a phone number to a speed dialling key

Press **Menu** in standby mode and select *Contacts* and *Speed dials*. Scroll to the desired key and press **Assign**. Press **Search** and select the name and number that you want to assign to the selected key.

If a phone number is already assigned to the key, you can view or change the number or delete the assignment by pressing **Options** and selecting the desired function

### **Business cards**

You can send or receive a person's contact information as a business card.

To send a business card to a compatible phone or other device that supports the vCard standard: Press or in standby mode, scroll to the desired name, and press **Details**. Press **Options** and select <u>Send bus</u>. card and <u>Via text message</u> or <u>Via multimedia</u> (network service).

When you receive a business card, press **Show** and **Save** to save the business card in the phone's memory. To discard the business card, press **Exit** and **OK**.

# ■ Settings (Menu 4)

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In this menu, you can change various phone settings. You can also reset some menu settings to their default values.

To access this menu: Press Menu in standby mode and select Settings.

### **Profiles**

Your phone has several setting groups, 'profiles', for which you can customise the phone tones for different events and environments.

To access this menu: Press Menu in standby mode and select Settings and Profiles.

- Select a profile that you want to activate or whose settings you want to change.
- 2. Select Activate, Personalise or Timed.
  - To activate the selected profile, select *Activate*.

- To activate the profile for a certain amount of time, select *Timed*and set the end time. When this time expires, the previous profile
  that was not timed, becomes active.
- To change the profile settings, select *Personalise*. Select the setting that you want to change and make the change.

Select *Light sequences* to activate the display and keypad lights for certain functions. For more information, see "Light alerts" on page xii.

For information on the other settings, see "Tone settings" on page 40. With *Profile name* you can rename the selected profile. The *General* profile cannot be renamed.

The name of the currently active profile is shown in standby mode, except when the *General* profile is active. If the profile is timed, (1) is shown in front of its name.



Tip: To change the profile quickly in standby mode, press the power key (and select the profile that you want to activate.

## **Tone settings**

You can change the tone and vibrator settings of the currently selected profile. The same settings can also be found in the *Profiles* menu, see page 39.

To access this menu: Press Menu in standby mode, and select *Settings* and *Tone settings*. Select

- Incoming call alert to choose how the phone notifies you of an incoming voice call. The options are Ringing, Ascending, Ring once, Beep once and Off.
  - Note that when the fold is open, all ringing tones are played in ascending mode.
- Ringing tone to select the tone that rings when you receive a voice call. To select a ringing tone from the Gallery menu, select Open gallery.
- Ringing volume to select the volume level for the ringing tones and message alert tones.
- Vibrating alert to set the phone to vibrate when you receive a call or message. The vibrating alert does not work when the phone is connected to a charger.
- Message alert tone to select the tone that you hear when you receive a
  message. To select the tone from the ringing tone list, select Ringing
  tone and the desired tone.
- Keypad tones to select the volume for keypad tones.
- Warning tones to set the phone to sound tones, for example, when the battery is running out of power.
- Alert for to set the phone to ring only upon calls from phone numbers
  that belong to a certain caller group. Scroll to the caller group that you
  want or All calls and press Mark. See also the Caller groups setting in
  the Contacts menu.

When *Incoming call alert* is set to *Off* and *Message alert tone* is set to *Off*, is shown in standby mode.

## Adding new tones to your phone

For availability of tones via the text messaging (SMS), multimedia messaging (MMS) or browser service, contact your network operator or service provider. The tones are saved in the *Gallery* menu.

## **Display settings**

To access this menu: Press Menu in standby mode, and select *Settings* and *Display settings*. Select

 Wallpaper to set the phone to show a background image, 'wallpaper', when the phone is in standby mode.

The wallpaper images can be found in the *Gallery* menu. You can save new images, for example, from multimedia messages.

To set an image as the wallpaper:

- To select the wallpaper image for the first time or to change the image, select Select wallpaper. Scroll to the folder that you want, press Open and scroll to the desired image. Press Options and select Set as wallpaper.
- If you have previously used the wallpaper but have then selected Off, select On.
- Colour schemes to select the colour for some parts of the phone display, such as the signal strength indicator.

- Operator logo to set the phone to display or hide the operator logo saved in the phone. If there is no operator logo available in the phone, this function is dimmed.
  - For availability of operator logos, contact your network operator or service provider.
- Screen saver timeout to set the time after which the screen saver feature is activated. The screen saver is a power saving feature which becomes active if the phone is not used for a certain length of time in standby mode. Note that the screen saver is deactivated when the phone is outside the network coverage area.

You can deactivate the screen saver by pressing any key.

- Display brightness to change the brightness level. Press < or > to decrease or increase the level, and press OK to accept it.
- Menu view to set the way the phone displays the main menu. If you
  select List, the menus are shown as a list. If you select Grid, the menus
  are shown as a grid. In the grid view, the menu name is shown at the
  top of the display.

## Time and date settings

To access this menu: Press Menu in standby mode, and select *Settings* and *Time and date settings*. Select

Clock to set the time, show (or hide) the time in standby mode or select
the 12-hour or 24-hour time format and the time zone. If the battery
is removed from the phone for a long time, you may need to set the
time again.

The clock settings apply to several functions such as *Messages*, *Call register*, *Alarm clock* and *Calendar*.

- Date to show (or hide) the date in standby mode, set the date or select
  the date format or date separator. If the battery is removed from the
  phone for a long time, you may need to set the date again.
- Auto-update of date & time to set the phone to automatically update
  the time and date according to the current time zone (network
  service).

Automatic update of date and time does not change the time you have set for the alarm clock, calendar or alarm notes.

### Personal shortcuts

You can select the function for the right selection key shown in standby mode and the functions ('personal shortcuts') that can be accessed by pressing **Go to** in standby mode or by entering the *Go to* menu.

To access this menu: Press Menu in standby mode, and select Settings and Personal shortcuts. Select

- Right selection key to select the function for the right selection key.
- Select 'Go to' options to select the functions for your shortcut list.
   Scroll to a function and press Mark to add it to the list. To remove a function from the list, press Unmark. To save the changes, press Done and Yes.

 Organise 'Go to' options to change the order of the functions on the list. Scroll to the desired function, press Move and select where you want to move the function to.

## Connectivity

In this menu, you can define when the phone connects to the GPRS network.

### **GPRS** connection

In this menu, you can define when the phone connects to the GPRS network (network service). For general information about the GPRS service, see page xiii.

To access this menu: Press Menu in standby mode, and select *Settings*, *Connectivity* and *GPRS*.

Select GPRS connection and Always online or When needed.

 If you select Always online, the phone automatically registers to a GPRS network when you switch the phone on, if the GPRS network is available in your location.

If you select *When needed*, the phone registers and connects to the GPRS network only if you use a function that needs the GPRS service. In this case, establishing the connection may take longer than when *Always online* is selected.

#### **GPRS** indicators

When the selected GPRS connection mode is *Always online* and the GPRS service is available, **G** is shown on the display.

When you start a function that uses the GPRS service, the phone connects to the GPRS network, **G** is shown and data transfer is possible.

If you receive a call or a text message, or make a call, during a GPRS connection, **\overline{\mathbb{E}}** is shown to indicate that the connection is suspended (on hold). The phone tries to re-establish the connection after the call.

# Call settings

To access this menu: Press Menu in standby mode, and select *Settings* and *Call settings*. Select

 Call divert to direct your incoming calls to your voice mailbox or to another phone number (network service). Divert options that are not supported by your SIM card or your network operator may not be shown.

Select the desired divert option, for example, *Divert if busy* to divert voice calls when your number is busy or when you reject an incoming call. Set the divert option on (*Activate*) or off (*Cancel*), or check whether the option is activated (*Check status*).

If you selected Activate, select where the calls are to be diverted to.
 For some divert options you can also select the time after which the call is diverted.

Several divert options can be active at the same time. When all calls are diverted,  $\rightarrow$  is shown in standby mode.

- Automatic volume control and On to set the phone to automatically keep the earpiece volume at the level that you select with or during a call. For example, if the environment is noisy, the phone increases the volume.
- Anykey answer and On if you want to answer an incoming call by briefly pressing any key, except the power key \_\_\_\_, and selection keys.
- Automatic redial to set the phone to make up to ten attempts to connect the call after an unsuccessful call attempt.
- Speed dialling and On if you want to call the names and phone numbers assigned to the speed dial keys 1/2 to 9 by pressing and holding the corresponding key.
- Call waiting and Activate to request the network to notify you when you receive a new call during a call (network service).
- Summary after call and On to set the phone to briefly display the approximate duration of the last call.
- Send my caller ID to show (Yes) your phone number to the person you
  are calling or to hide it (No). If you select Set by network, the setting
  agreed upon with your service provider is used. This is a network
  service.

# Phone settings

To access this menu: Press Menu in standby mode, and select Settings and Phone settings. Select

#### Menu functions

- Phone language to select the language for the display texts. If you select Automatic, the phone selects the language according to the information on the SIM card.
- Memory status to view the total amount of free and used shared memory and the amount of memory used by different functions.
- Automatic keyguard to set the keypad to lock automatically after a
  certain length of time when the phone is in standby mode. See also
  "Keypad lock (Keyquard)" on page 9.

To activate the automatic keyguard, select *On* and set the time after which the keypad is locked. To deactivate the automatic keyguard, select *Off*.

When the keyguard is on, calls may be possible to the official emergency number programmed into your device.

- Cell info display to set the phone to indicate when it is used in a cellular network based on the Micro Cellular Network (MCN) technology (network service).
- Welcome note to define a note that is shown briefly when the phone is switched on. To save the note, press Options and select Save.
- Operator selection to set the phone to automatically select a cellular network that is available in your area (Automatic) or to select the desired network from a list (Manual).

The selected network must have a roaming agreement with your home operator's network. If *No network access* is displayed, select another network.

The phone stays in manual mode until automatic mode is selected or another SIM card is inserted into the phone.

- Help text activation to set the phone to show help texts that guide you in using the menu functions.
- Start-up tone to set the phone to play a tone when the phone is switched on.

# **Enhancement settings**

You can define the settings that the phone uses by default when it is connected to a compatible enhancement.

To access this menu: Press Menu in standby mode, and select *Settings* and *Enhancement settings*.

Select the desired enhancement, for example *Headset*. Depending on the enhancement, you can select some of the following functions:

- Default profile to select the profile that is automatically activated when you connect the selected enhancement to the phone.
- Automatic answer to set the phone to automatically answer an incoming call after five seconds. If the *Incoming call alert* is set to Beep once or Off, automatic answer cannot be used.
- *Lights* to set the lights *On* or *Off*.

## Enhancement indicators in standby mode

When a compatible enhancement is connected to the phone, the corresponding indicator (for example  $\bigcirc$ ) is shown in standby mode.

## **Security settings**

To access this menu: Press Menu in standby mode, and select *Settings* and *Security settings*.

When security features that restrict calls are in use (such as call barring, closed user group and fixed dialing) calls may be possible to the official emergency number programmed into your device.

### Select

- PIN code request to set the phone to ask for your PIN code every time
  the phone is switched on. Some SIM cards do not allow this setting to
  be changed.
- Call barring service to restrict the calls that can be made or received with the phone (network service).
- Fixed dialling to restrict calls and text messages from your phone to selected phone numbers, if allowed by your SIM card (network service).
  - When the fixed dialling option is on, GPRS connections can only be used for sending text messages. The recipient's phone number and the message centre number have to be included on the fixed dialling list.
- Closed user group to specify a group of people whom you can call and who can call you (network service). When you use a closed user group, the group number is shown in standby mode.
- Security level to define when the phone asks for the security code.
   If you select *Phone*, the phone asks for the security code when a new SIM card is inserted into the phone.

If you select *Memory*, the security code is requested when the memory in use is *SIM card* and you want to change the memory to *Phone* or *Phone and SIM* or when you want to copy names and numbers from one contacts list to another.

When you change this setting, the numbers in the menus *Missed calls*, *Received calls* and *Dialled numbers* are deleted.

 Access codes to change the security code, PIN code, PIN2 code or barring password. Codes can only include numbers from 0 to 9.

# Restore factory settings

You can reset some of the menu settings to their original values.

Press **Menu** in standby mode, and select *Settings* and *Restore factory settings*. Key in the security code and press **OK**. Note that this function does not delete the information that you have saved or downloaded to the phone.

# ■ Gallery (Menu 5)

In this menu, you can manage graphics and tones that you have saved, for example, from multimedia messages. JPEG and BMP format files are supported. These files are arranged in folders.

Your phone supports a Digital Rights Management (DRM) system to protect content that you have acquired to the phone. A piece of content, such as a ringing tone, can be protected and associated with certain usage rules, for example the number of usage times and a certain usage period. The rules are defined in the content's activation key that can be

delivered with the content or separately, depending on the service provider. You may be able to update these activation keys. Always check the delivery terms of any content and activation key before acquiring them, as they may be subject to a fee.

The gallery uses shared memory, see page ix.

- 1. Press **Menu** and select *Gallery*. The list of options is shown.
- 2. Select *View folders* to open the list of folders.

### Other options are:

- Add folder, Delete folder, Rename folder: You can add a new folder
  or delete or rename the folder that you select. The preset folders
  cannot be deleted or renamed.
- *Memory status* to view how much free memory is available.
- Activation key list: You can view the list of available activation keys. Scroll to the desired file and press Options. Select Details to view the activation keys.
- Downloads: You can download images and tones (network service).
   A list of bookmarks is shown. Select More bookmarks if you want to view the bookmarks available in the Services menu. Select the bookmark of the browser page that you want to access. Follow the instructions provided by the service.
- 3. To open a folder, scroll to the desired folder and press **Open**. The files in the folder are shown.
  - Pressing **Options** allows access to some of the functions described in "Options for the files in the gallery" on page 53.

To view an image or listen to a sound, scroll to the desired image or sound file, press **Options** and select *Open*.

# Options for the files in the gallery

When you have selected or opened a file, you can press **Options** for the following functions: *Open, Delete, Send, Edit image, Move, Rename, Set as wallpaper, Set as ring tone, Details, Sort, Activation key list.* Select

- Send to send the file as a multimedia message.
- Edit image to add text and clip-art to the selected image or to crop the image. Press Options and select the desired function.

If you selected *Insert text*, key in the text that you want, press **OK** and move the text with the scroll keys. If you press **Options**, you can select the style, size and colour of the text font and rotate the text. To confirm the changes, press **Options** and select *OK*.

If you selected *Insert clip-art*, scroll to the desired image, press **Options** and select *Insert*. Move the inserted image with the scroll keys and press **OK**.

To save the modified image in GIF format, press **Options**, select *Save*, edit the image's name, press **OK** and select the desired folder.

- Details to view, for example, the size of the file.
- Sort to sort the files and folders by name, date, format or size.
- Activation key list to update the activation key of the selected file. This
  option is only shown if the activation key of the file can be updated.

Copyright protections may prevent some images, music (including ringing tones), and other content from being copied, modified, transferred or forwarded.

# Organiser (Menu 6)



In this menu, you can use the phone's built-in alarm clock and calendar

To access this menu: Press Menu in standby mode and select *Organiser*.

### Alarm clock

You can set the phone to alarm at the desired time. The alarm clock works even if you close the fold.

To access this menu: Press Menu in standby mode and select *Organiser* and *Alarm clock*.

To set an alarm, select *Alarm time*, key in the alarm time and press **OK**. To change the alarm time, select *On*.

To set a tone for the alarm, select *Alarm tone* and the desired tone.

When the alarm clock is on, \* is shown in standby mode.

## When the alarm time expires

The phone will sound an alert tone and flash *Alarm!* and the current time on the display. Press **Stop** to stop the alarm. If you let the phone alarm for a minute or press **Snooze**, the alarm stops for about ten minutes and then resumes.

If the alarm time is reached while the device is switched off, the device switches itself on and starts sounding the alarm tone. If you select **Stop**, the device asks whether you want to activate the device for calls. Select No to switch off the device or Yes to make and receive calls. Do not select **Yes** when wireless phone use may cause interference or danger.

### Calendar

The calendar uses shared memory, see page ix.

To access this menu: Press Menu in standby mode and select *Organiser* and Calendar. The month view is shown. You can scroll through the days, weeks and months with the scroll keys.



**Tip:** To quickly open the calendar in standby mode, press .



## Using the different calendar views

• Month view: This view shows the weeks of a month. The current day is indicated by a frame around it. If there are notes for the day, the day is shown in bold. To view the notes set for a day ('day view'), scroll to the desired day, press **Options** and select *Day notes*.

Pressing **Options** also allows access to the following functions: Week view, Make a note, Go to date, Settings. Select

• Settings to set the date and time or to select their format, the separator character (for example - ) or the first day of the week (Week starts on). With Auto-delete you can set the phone to delete old notes automatically after a certain length of time.

Day view: This view shows the notes set for the selected day. You can scroll through the notes by pressing or and through the days by pressing or . Press Options and select *View* to open the selected note ('note view').

Pressing **Options** also allows access to the following functions: *Make a note, Delete, Edit, Move, Repeat, Go to date, Send note, Copy, Settings.*Select

- Repeat to select the interval at which the note is repeated.
- Note view: This view shows the note that you opened in the day view.
   You can press Options for the following functions: Edit, Delete, Move, Repeat, Send note, Copy, Settings.

## Making a calendar note

You can create a new note in the month, week or day view.

In the month or week view, scroll to the desired day, press **Options** and select *Make a note*. In the day view, press **Options** and select *Make a note*. Select one of the following note types: Meeting, Call, Memo, Extended.

Make a note and save it. For example, to save a note for a meeting with an alarm, do as follows:

Key in the subject for the meeting, press **Options** and select *Save*. Key in the location, press **Options** and select *Save*. Key in the start date and press **OK**. Key in the end date and press **OK**. Key in the start time and press **OK**. Key in the end time and press **OK**. To set the alarm for the note, select *With tone* or *Silent* (no alarm tone) and set the alarm time.

#### When the phone sounds an alarm for a note

The phone beeps and displays the note. When a call note  $\Box$  is displayed, you can call the number by pressing  $\Box$ .

To stop the alarm and view the note, press **View**. If you press **Snooze** when the note is shown, the alarm stops for about ten minutes and then resumes.

To stop the alarm without viewing the note, press Exit.

## Applications (Menu 7)



In this menu, you can use and manage the Java games and applications installed in the phone.

To access this menu: Press Menu in standby mode and select *Applications*.

The phone supports Java 2 Micro Edition (J2ME™) which is a version of Java technology specifically designed for small consumer electronics products.

Before you can use a Java application you have to transfer it to your phone. Java applications use shared memory, see page ix.

#### Games

In this menu, you can play the Java games installed in the phone.

To access this menu: Press **Menu** in standby mode and select *Applications* and *Games*.

Game settings: Select *App. settings* to set sounds, lights and vibrations (*Application shakes*) for the games. When the *Vibrating alert* function in the *Tone settings* menu is off, the phone does not vibrate even if you set *Application shakes* to on.

To start a game, select *Select game*, scroll to the desired game and press \_\_\_\_, or press **Options** and select *Open*. You can press **Options** for the same functions as in the *Collection* menu. Note that running some games may consume the phone's battery faster (and you may need to connect the phone to the charger).

To view the amount of memory available for games, select *Memory*.

To download a game to the phone, select *Game downloads*. A list of bookmarks is shown. Select *More bookmarks* if you want to view the bookmarks available in the *Services* menu. Select the bookmark of the browser page that you want to access. Follow the instructions provided by the service. When downloading a game, it may be saved in the *Collection* menu instead of the *Games* menu.

#### Collection

In this menu, you can use and manage the Java applications installed in the phone.

To access this menu: Press **Menu** in standby mode and select *Applications* and *Collection*.

To launch an application, select *Select application*. Scroll to the application or application set that you want to use. Press **Options** and select *Open*, or press , to launch the application or to open the application set.

Note that running some applications may consume the phone's battery faster (and you may need to connect the phone to the charger).

Other options available for an application or application set You can access the functions below by pressing **Options** in the applications list. Select

- Delete to delete the selected application or application set from the phone.
- Details to view additional information about the application.
- Update version to look for a new version of the application from an Internet service (network service).
- Web page to access an Internet page related to the application (network service). This option is shown only if the application contains the Internet address of the page.
- Web access to restrict the application from accessing the network.
   Select Ask first to set the phone to ask for access, Allowed to allow the access, or Not allowed not to allow the access.
- Connect via to set the phone to use specific service settings if the application needs them. The phone uses as default the service settings for the browser.

#### Downloading a Java application

You can download new Java applications as follows:

- In the Collection menu, select App. downloads. A list of bookmarks is shown. Select More bookmarks if you want to view the bookmarks available in the Services menu. Select the bookmark of the browser page you want to access. Follow the instructions provided by the service.
- Press Menu in standby mode and select Services to access a browser page from which you can download the Java application that you want.
- Use the Game downloads function in the Games menu.



**Important:** Only install and use applications and other software from sources that offer adequate security and protection against harmful software.

When downloading a game or an application, it may be saved in the *Games* menu instead of in the *Collection* menu.

#### Checking the memory status

To check the amount of memory available for Java applications, select *Memory* in the *Collection* menu.

## Extras (Menu 8)



#### Calculator



Note: This calculator has limited accuracy and is designed for simple calculations.

Press **Menu** in standby mode, and select *Extras* and *Calculator*.

#### Making a calculation

- 1. Use on to onsert a digit. Press for a decimal point.
- 3. For a result, press **Options** and select *Equals*.
- 4. Press and hold Clear for a new calculation.

## Making a currency conversion

- To save the exchange rate, press Options and select Exchange rate.
   Select either of the available conversion options. Key in the exchange rate (press \*\* for a decimal point) and press OK.
- To make the conversion, key in the desired amount, press Options and select In domestic or In foreign.



Tip: To make a currency conversion in standby mode, key in the amount, press **Options** and select *In domestic* or *In foreign*.

### **Stopwatch**

Press Menu, and select Extras and Stopwatch.

Select *Split timing* or *Lap timing* and press **Start** to start timing. To take the time, press **Stop**. When the timing is stopped, you can press **Options** for *Start*, *Save*, or *Reset*. If you select *Start*, timing continues from the previous stop time. *Reset* stops the current timing and sets the time to zero.

To set the timing to continue in the background, press . While the time is running, **3** appears in standby mode.

Using the stopwatch or allowing it to run in the background when using other features increases the demand on battery power and reduces the battery life.

#### Countdown timer

Press **Menu**, select *Extras* and *Countdown timer*. Key in the alarm time and press **OK**. You can also key in a note for the alarm, change the time and stop the timer.

When the timer is running, (1) is shown in standby mode.

When the alarm time is reached, the phone sounds a tone and flashes the related text. Press any key to stop the alarm.

## ■ Services (Menu 9)



This menu contains a browser that you can use to access various services (network service). These services may include, for example, weather reports, news or flight times.

To access this menu: Press Menu in standby mode and select Services.

Check the availability, pricing and tariffs of these browser services with your network operator and/or the service provider. They will also give you instructions on how to use their services.

With your phone's multi-mode browser you can view services that use Wireless Mark-Up Language (WML) or extensible HyperText Markup Language (xHTML) on their pages.



**Important:** Use only services that you trust and that offer adequate security and protection against harmful software.

## Basic steps for accessing and using browser services

- 1. Save the settings that are needed to access the service that you want to use. See page 63.
- 2. Make a connection to the given service. See page 65.
- 3. Start browsing the pages of the service. See page 66.
- 4. Once you are finished browsing, end the connection to the service. See page 67.

## Setting up the phone for a browser service

You may receive the service settings as an Over The Air (OTA) message from the network operator or service provider that offers the service you want to use. You can also key in the settings manually.

For more information and the appropriate settings, contact your network operator or service provider that offers the service. The settings may be available, for example, on their website.

#### Saving the service settings received as a message

- To save the received settings, press **Options** and select *Save*.
- To view or discard the received settings, press Options and select View or Discard.

### Keying in the service settings manually

- In the Services menu, select Settings, Connection settings and Active service settings.
- Scroll to the connection set that you want to activate and press
   Activate. A connection set is a collection of settings needed to make a
   connection to a service.
- 3. Select Edit active service settings.
- Select the settings one by one and key in all the required settings according to the information that you have received from your network operator or service provider.

#### **Appearance settings**

 While browsing, press Options and select Other options and Appear. settings. Or in the Services menu, select Settings and Appearance settings.

#### 2. Select

- Text wrapping to define whether the text continues on the next line
  if it cannot be shown on one line.
- Font size to select the size for text shown on browser pages.
- Show images to show or hide the images on browser pages.

### **Cookie settings**

You can set the phone to allow or prevent the receipt of cookies.

A cookie is a data item, for example your user information, that the service saves in the cache memory of your phone. Cookies are deleted if you clear the cache memory, see page 69.

- While browsing, press Options and select Other options, Security and Cookie settings. Or in the Services menu, select Settings, Security settings and Cookies.
- 2. Select Allow or Reject.

## Making a connection to a browser service

- Activate the settings of the service that you want to use:
   In the Services menu, select Settings and Connection settings. Select Active service settings, scroll to the desired connection set and press Activate.
- 2. Make a connection in one of the following ways:
  - Open the start page, for example the homepage of the service provider: In the *Services* menu, select *Home*. **OR:** Press and hold [30] in standby mode.
  - Select the bookmark of the service: In the Services menu, select
     *Bookmarks* and the desired bookmark.
    - If the bookmark does not work with the current active service settings, activate another set of service settings and try again.

 Key in the address of the service: In the Services menu, select Go to address, key in the address (press \* for special characters), and press OK.

## Browsing the pages of a service

After you have made a connection to the service, you can start browsing its pages. The functions of the phone keys may vary in different services. Follow the text guides on the display.

If GPRS is selected as the data bearer, see "GPRS connection" on page 45 for the GPRS indicators shown during the connection.

#### Using the phone keys while browsing

- Use the scroll keys to browse through the page.
- To select a highlighted item, press  $\square$ .
- To key in letters and numbers, use the keys ot to wir. To insert a special character, press .

#### Options while browsing

Some of the following options may be available while browsing. Press **Options** and select the desired option. The service provider may also offer other options.

The options are: *Open, Shortcuts, Home, Add bookmark, Bookmarks* (see page 68), *Download links, Save to folder, Other options, Reload, Quit* (to end the connection, see page 67).

#### Select

- Home to return to the homepage of the service provider.
- Shortcuts to open a new list of options that can be, for example, specific to the page.
- Add bookmark to save the current page as a bookmark.
- Download links to view the list of bookmarks for downloading content.
   For more information, see step 2 in "Downloading content and applications" on page xiii.
- Other options to view a list of other available options. These include
   Save image, Use detail (to copy, for example, a phone number from the
   page), Go to address, Service inbox (see page 68), Appear. settings (see
   page 64), Security (for security information and cookie setting), Clear
   the cache (see page 69).
- Reload to reload and update the current page.

## Disconnecting from a browser service

To quit browsing and to end the connection, press **Options**, select *Quit* and, when *Quit browsing?* is shown, press **Yes**. **OR:** Press and hold \_\_\_\_\_\_.

A cache is a memory location that is used to store data temporarily. If you have tried to access or have accessed confidential information requiring passwords, empty the cache after each use. The information or services you have accessed is stored in the cache. To empty the cache, see "Emptying the cache memory" on page 69.

#### **Bookmarks**

To use and manage the page addresses that you have saved as bookmarks in the phone's memory:

- 1. While browsing, press **Options** and select *Bookmarks*, or select *Bookmarks* in the *Services* menu.
- 2. Scroll to the desired bookmark and press **Options**.
- Select Go to to make a connection to the page associated with the bookmark. You can also, for example, edit or delete the bookmark, send it to another phone, save it in the desired folder or create a new bookmark.

Your device may have some bookmarks loaded for sites not affiliated with Nokia. Nokia does not warrant or endorse these sites. If you choose to access them, you should take the same precautions, for security or content, as you would with any Internet site.

#### Receiving a bookmark

When you receive a bookmark as an OTA message, press **Options** and select *View* to view the bookmark or *Save* to add it to the bookmark list. To discard a bookmark received as an OTA message, press **Exit**.

#### Service inhox

The phone is able to receive service messages ('pushed messages') from your service provider (network service).

To set the phone to receive service messages: In the *Services* menu, select *Settings, Service inbox settings, Service messages*, and *On*.

To set the phone to automatically fetch the content indicated in the service message: In the Services menu, select Settings, Service inbox settings, Automatic connection and On.

To view a service message:

- Press Show to view the message immediately or press Exit to view it later in Service inbox in the Services menu. OR: While browsing, press Options and select Other options and Service inbox.
- Scroll to the message you want and press Options. Select Retrieve to fetch the content indicated in the message, Details to view the details of the service message or Delete to delete the message.

## Emptying the cache memory

In the Services menu, select Clear the cache. **OR:** While browsing, press **Options** and select Other options and Clear the cache.

## **Browser security**

Security features may be required for some services, such as banking services. For such connections you need security certificates and possibly a security module which may be available on your SIM card. For more information, contact your service provider.

#### Security module

The security module can contain certificates as well as private and public keys. The security module is to improve security services for functions requiring browser connection, and allows you to use a digital signature. The certificates are saved in the security module by the service provider.

In the Services menu, select Settings, Security settings and Security module settings. Select

- Security module details to view the security module's title, status, manufacturer and serial number.
- Module PIN request and On to set the phone to ask for the module PIN when using services provided by the security module.
- Change module PIN to change the module PIN, if allowed by the security module.

#### Certificates

The phone supports three kinds of certificates: server certificates, authority certificates and user certificates. You may receive these certificates from a service provider. Authority certificates and user certificates may also be saved in the security module by the service provider. For details and availability, contact your service provider.

When using a server certificate, the security indicator is displayed during a connection, if the data transmission between the phone and the gateway (identified by the *IP address* in the *Edit active service settings*) is encrypted.

The security icon does not indicate that the data transmission between the gateway and the content server (or place where the requested resource is stored) is secure. The service provider secures the data transmission between the gateway and the content server.



Important: Even if the use of certificates makes the risks involved in remote connections and software installation considerably smaller, they must be used correctly in order to benefit from increased security. The existence of a certificate does not offer any protection by itself; the certificate manager must contain correct, authentic, or trusted certificates for increased security to be available. Certificates have a restricted lifetime. If Expired certificate or Certificate not valid yet is shown even if the certificate should be valid, check that the current date and time in your device are correct.

Before changing any certificate settings, you must make sure that you really trust the owner of the certificate and that the certificate really belongs to the listed owner.

## ■ Go to (Menu 10)

In this menu, you can activate the functions that can be accessed by pressing **Go to** in standby mode.



To access this menu: Press **Menu** in standby mode and select *Go to*.

To remove functions from or add more functions to the list, see "Personal shortcuts" on page 44.

## ■ SIM services (Menu 11)

For more information, contact your service provider.



## 6. Battery information

## Charging and discharging

Your device is powered by a rechargeable battery. The full performance of a new battery is achieved only after two or three complete charge and discharge cycles. The battery can be charged and discharged hundreds of times, but it will eventually wear out. When the talk and standby times are noticeably shorter than normal, replace the battery. Use only Nokia approved batteries, and recharge your battery only with Nokia approved chargers designated for this device.

If a replacement battery is being used for the first time or if the battery has not been used for a prolonged period, it may be necessary to connect the charger then disconnect and reconnect it to begin charging the battery.

Unplug the charger from the electrical plug and the device when not in use. Do not leave a fully charged battery connected to a charger, since overcharging may shorten its lifetime. If left unused, a fully charged battery will lose its charge over time.

If the battery is completely discharged, it may take a few minutes before the charging indicator appears on the display or before any calls can be made.

Use the battery only for its intended purpose. Never use any charger or battery that is damaged.

Do not short-circuit the battery. Accidental short-circuiting can occur when a metallic object such as a coin, clip, or pen causes direct connection of the positive (+) and negative (-) terminals of the battery. (These look like metal strips on the battery.) This might happen, for example, when you carry a spare battery in your pocket or purse. Short-circuiting the terminals may damage the battery or the connecting object.

Leaving the battery in hot or cold places, such as in a closed car in summer or winter conditions, will reduce the capacity and lifetime of the battery. Always try to keep the battery between 15°C and 25°C (59°F and 77°F). A device with a hot or cold battery may not work temporarily, even when the battery is fully charged. Battery performance is particularly limited in temperatures well below freezing.

Do not dispose of batteries in a fire as they may explode. Batteries may also explode if damaged. Dispose of batteries according to local regulations. Please recycle when possible. Do not dispose as household waste.

## 7. Genuine Enhancements

A new extensive range of enhancements is available for your phone. Select the enhancements which accommodate your specific communication needs.



Some of the enhancements are described in detail below.

For availability of the enhancements, please check with your local dealer. A few practical rules for enhancements operation:

- Keep the enhancements out of small children's reach.
- When you disconnect the power cord of any accessory, grasp and pull the plug, not the cord.
- Check regularly that all mobile phone equipment in a vehicle is mounted and operating properly.

Use only batteries, chargers and enhancements approved by the phone manufacturer. The use of any other types may invalidate any approval or warranty applying to the phone, and may be dangerous.





## Boom Headset (HDB-5)

Compact and functional, the Boom Headset provides you with a convenient, portable hansfree facility. For operation, safety, care and maintenance, see your phone's user's guide.



## Personal Headset Kit (HDC-5)

The compact and functional personal Handsfree Kit with Remote Control. By using the remote control option, you can answer and end calls by pressing the button on the microphone part of the Personal Handsfree. A cost-effective, hands-free solution for indoor or outdoor use.



## Plug and Play Handsfree (PPH-1)

To provide you with a convenient and portable handsfree facility while in vehicle, this kit comes with a built-in speaker which allows you to talk and charge your phone at the same time. You should ensure that the kit, which requires an input voltage of 12 volts, can be properly plugged into the cigarette lighter socket and does not hamper the operation of your vehicle. Simply connect the mobile charger to your vehicle's cigarette lighter socket and to your phone. Should be used together with an invehicle holder. May be used with or without optional external microphone HFM-8. Charging time is dependent on the condition of the battery.

## Mobile Charger (LCH-9)

The multi-voltage Mobile Charger, LCH-9, ensures your phone is always ready for use whenever you travel. This small charger's functional design fits most car lighters and interiors.

A green light indicates that the Mobile Charger is ready for charging. Check the charging status on the phone display. The input voltage can be 12 or 24 V DC, negative grounding.

Avoid prolonged charging with the Mobile Charger when the car engine is not running; this may cause the battery of your car to drain. Note also that in some cars the cigarette lighter plug is not provided with electricity if the ignition is switched off. Verify that the green LED light is on.

# Mobile inductive loopset for people with hearing aids (LPS-3)

The LPS-3 is a convenient, easy-to-use portable accessory for users of hearing aids. It connects directly to the bottom of your phone and enables you to use a hearing aid together with your mobile phone.



The LPS-3 is worn around the neck and contains a microphone within the device therefore you do not need to hold the phone near your ear. Additionally the phone can be attached to your belt with the use of the optional belt clip or you can place it in your pocket.

The operation of this device is based on induction technology used in public places: a loop system sends out wireless sounds to be picked up by the telecoil of the hearing aid (switched to T-mode)

## 8. Care and maintenance

Your device is a product of superior design and craftsmanship and should be treated with care. The suggestions below will help you protect your warranty coverage.

- Keep the device dry. Precipitation, humidity and all types of liquids or moisture
  can contain minerals that will corrode electronic circuits. If your device does
  get wet, remove the battery, and allow the device to dry completely before
  replacing it.
- Do not use or store the device in dusty, dirty areas. Its moving parts and electronic components can be damaged.
- Do not store the device in hot areas. High temperatures can shorten the life of electronic devices, damage batteries, and warp or melt certain plastics.
- Do not store the device in cold areas. When the device returns to its normal temperature, moisture can form inside the device and damage electronic circuit boards.
- Do not attempt to open the device other than as instructed in this guide.
- Do not drop, knock, or shake the device. Rough handling can break internal circuit boards and fine mechanics.
- Do not use harsh chemicals, cleaning solvents, or strong detergents to clean the device.
- Do not paint the device. Paint can clog the moving parts and prevent proper operation.
- Use only the supplied or an approved replacement antenna. Unauthorized antennas, modifications, or attachments could damage the device and may violate regulations governing radio devices.

- Use chargers indoors.
- Always create a backup of data you want to keep, such as contacts and calendar notes, before sending your device to a service facility.

All of the above suggestions apply equally to your device, battery, charger, or any enhancement. If any device is not working properly, take it to the nearest authorized service facility for service.

## 9. Additional safety information

Your device and its enhancements may contain small parts. Keep them out of the reach of small children

#### Operating environment

Remember to follow any special regulations in force in any area, and always switch off your device when its use is prohibited or when it may cause interference or danger. Use the device only in its normal operating positions. This device meets RF exposure guidelines when used either in the normal use position against the ear or when positioned at least 1.5 centimeters away from the body. When a carry case, belt clip or holder is used for body-worn operation, it should not contain metal and should position the device the above-stated distance from your body.

To transmit data files or messages, this device requires a quality connection to the network. In some cases, transmission of data files or messages may be delayed until such a connection is available. Ensure that the above separation distance instructions are followed until the transmission is completed.

Parts of the device are magnetic. Metallic materials may be attracted to the device. Do not place credit cards or other magnetic storage media near the device, because information stored on them may be erased.

#### Medical devices

Operation of any radio transmitting equipment, including wireless phones, may interfere with the functionality of inadequately protected medical devices. Consult a physician or the manufacturer of the medical device to determine if they are adequately shielded from external RF energy or if you have any questions. Switch off your device in health care facilities when any regulations posted in these areas

instruct you to do so. Hospitals or health care facilities may be using equipment that could be sensitive to external RF energy.

#### **Pacemakers**

Pacemaker manufacturers recommend that a minimum separation of 15.3 centimeters (6 inches) be maintained between a wireless phone and a pacemaker to avoid potential interference with the pacemaker. These recommendations are consistent with the independent research by and recommendations of Wireless Technology Research. Persons with pacemakers should do the following:

- Always keep the device more than 15.3 centimeters (6 inches) from the pacemaker
- Not carry the device in a breast pocket
- Hold the device to the ear opposite the pacemaker to minimize the potential for interference.

If you suspect interference, switch off your device, and move the device away.

#### Hearing aids

Some digital wireless devices may interfere with some hearing aids. If interference occurs, consult your service provider.

#### Vehicles

RF signals may affect improperly installed or inadequately shielded electronic systems in motor vehicles such as electronic fuel injection systems, electronic antiskid (antilock) braking systems, electronic speed control systems, and air bag systems. For more information, check with the manufacturer or its representative of your vehicle or any equipment that has been added.

#### Additional safety information

Only qualified personnel should service the device, or install the device in a vehicle. Faulty installation or service may be dangerous and may invalidate any warranty that may apply to the device. Check regularly that all wireless device equipment in your vehicle is mounted and operating properly. Do not store or carry flammable liquids, gases, or explosive materials in the same compartment as the device, its parts, or enhancements. For vehicles equipped with an air bag, remember that air bags inflate with great force. Do not place objects, including installed or portable wireless equipment in the area over the air bag or in the air bag deployment area. If in-vehicle wireless equipment is improperly installed and the air bag inflates, serious injury could result.

Using your device while flying in aircraft is prohibited. Switch off your device before boarding an aircraft. The use of wireless teledevices in an aircraft may be dangerous to the operation of the aircraft, disrupt the wireless telephone network, and may be illegal.

## Potentially explosive environments

Switch off your device when in any area with a potentially explosive atmosphere and obey all signs and instructions. Potentially explosive atmospheres include areas where you would normally be advised to turn off your vehicle engine. Sparks in such areas could cause an explosion or fire resulting in bodily injury or even death. Switch off the device at refueling points such as near gas pumps at service stations. Observe restrictions on the use of radio equipment in fuel depots, storage, and distribution areas; chemical plants; or where blasting operations are in progress. Areas with a potentially explosive atmosphere are often but not always clearly marked. They include below deck on boats, chemical transfer or storage facilities, vehicles using liquefied petroleum gas (such as propane or butane), and areas where the air contains chemicals or particles such as grain, dust or metal powders.

## Emergency calls



#### Important:

Wireless phones, including this device, operate using radio signals, wireless networks, landline networks, and user-programmed functions. Because of this, connections in all conditions cannot be guaranteed. You should never rely solely on any wireless device for essential communications like medical emergencies.

#### To make an emergency call:

- If the device is not on, switch it on. Check for adequate signal strength.
   Some networks may require that a valid SIM card is properly inserted in the device.
- Press as many times as needed to clear the display and ready the device for calls.
- 3. Enter the official emergency number for your present location. Emergency numbers vary by location.
- 4. Press .

If certain features are in use, you may first need to turn those features off before you can make an emergency call. Consult this guide or your service provider for more information.

When making an emergency call, give all the necessary information as accurately as possible. Your wireless device may be the only means of communication at the scene of an accident. Do not end the call until given permission to do so.

## THIS DEVICE MEETS INTERNATIONAL GUIDELINES FOR EXPOSURE TO RADIO WAVES

## **Limited Warranty**

Nokia Corporation, represented by its Mobile Phones Division ("Nokia") warrants that this Nokia cellular product and/or genuine Nokia accessory ("Product") is free from defects in material and workmanship, according to the following terms and conditions:

- The limited warranty for the cellular phone, data product and all genuine Nokia accessories (except battery packs) extends for the first twelve (12) months beginning on the date of purchase of the Product.
- The limited warranty for genuine Nokia battery packs extends for the first six (6) months beginning on the date of purchase of the Product.
- The limited warranty extends only to the original consumer purchaser ("Consumer") of the Product and is not assignable or transferable to any subsequent purchaser/end user.
- The limited warranty extends only to Consumers who purchase the Product in one of the countries (or areas) set forth at the end of this document. The limited warranty is only valid in Nokia's intended country (or area) of sale of the Product.
- 5. During the limited warranty period, Nokia or its authorized service network will repair or replace, at Nokia's option, any defective Product or parts thereof with new or factory rebuilt replacement items, and return the Product to the Consumer in working condition.
